This slim guide describes the history of Ecuador, its cultural heritage and current political, environmental and economic challenges. With maps, photographs and some travel information. It's an excellent synopsis from an unabashedly left-leaning perspective, strong on facts. (Item no. EDR02)

A lively, lucid portrait of the rain forest as seen by two uncommonly observant and thoughtful field biologists. Its 17 marvelous essays introduce the habitats, ecology, plants and animals of the Central and South American rain forest. With a lengthy appendix of practical advice for the tropical traveler. Miller's entertaining and insightful social history of Ecuador -- as told through its hat-making history. It's a classic example of travel writing, and one of the best things written on Ecuador. A first-hand account of a naive journalist among the Huarani of the Ecuadorian Amazon. In the struggle for the control of their homeland, it is certainly not the local people who behave as savages. An illustrated guide to the region, its wildlife and conservation by an international team of biologists and photographers. Several chapters are devoted to the people of the region and to a country-by-country survey of the river's features.
