Moon Handbook Pacific Mexico

2005, PAPER, 750 PAGES, \$19.95

This compact guide covers areas along Mexico's Pacific coast from Mazatlan south to Oaxaca. It combines text on history, culture and nature with practical information for travelers, and it features plenty of photographs, maps and illustrations. (Item no. MEX76)

Chasing Monarchs, A Migration with the Butterflies of Passage

A memoir of Lepidoptery, combining the entomologist-author's considerable knowledge of butterflies and their biology with a rambling road trip from British Columbia through the Southwest to Mexico. (Item no. MEX62)

Four Wings and a Prayer, Caught in the Mystery of the Monarch Butterfly

A lyrical account of travels and encounters on the trail of the migrating monarch. Halpern weaves her own experiences with science, interviews and commentary, includes a section on the butterfly wintering grounds in Mexico. (Item no. NAT52)
