Insight Guide Peru

2005, PAPER, 352 PAGES, \$23.95

In its hallmark style, this guide brings Peru to life in hundreds of color photographs and vividly written essays by a team of experts. Panoramic in scope, the book takes us from the crowded streets of Lima to famed archeological sites, providing genuine insight into a complex land and people. Its chapters include a history of the Incas, daily life in the Andes, the author and politician Mario Vargas Llosa and an overview of people of the Amazon. With some travel information. (Item no. Peru in Focus, A Guide to the People, Politics and Culture

Lost City of the Incas, The Story of Machu Picchu and its Builders

2001, PAPER, 263 PAGES, \$15.95

A first-rate tale of adventure by the man who rediscovered Machu Picchu in 1911. This classic account is a gripping story of exploration, archaeology and natural history -- and still an outstanding overview of the site itself. With original expedition photographs. Originally published in 1952, the book is still an excellent account, not only of the expedition but also of the site itself. (Item no. AND05)

The Peru Reader, History, Culture, Politics

A lively, literate anthology on the history and culture of Peru that ranges from historical accounts to modern analysis. It's a comprehensive introduction to the country. The excellent selections were made by a panel of Peruvian and foreign experts. (Item no. PRU04)

With information on new discoveries and research, a section on wildlife, and a full-color, depiction of the city as it may have appeared during a solstice celebration in 1530. (Item no. PRU34)

The Incas and their Ancestors, The Archaeology of Peru

2001, PAPER, 288 PAGES, \$29.95

An outstanding illustrated survey of the archaeology of the Inca, Moche and Nasca civilizations. With hundreds of color illustrations and line drawings, it's an in-depth look at the ancient cultures and history of Peru, a great general introduction. (Item no. AND06)

Peter Matthiessen

Cloud Forest: A Chronicle of the South American Wilderness
