2005, PAPER, 391 PAGES, \$19.95

A pocket guide to Maya archaeology. This lavishly illustrated small book features hundreds of color photographs and illustrations -- along with excerpts from key works and a brief guide to Maya arithmetic, their calendar, and inscriptions. (Item no. MYA01)

The Labyrinth of Solitude

1985, PAPER, 398 PAGES, \$14.50

An enduring classic by the Nobel prize-winning poet and essayist Octavio Paz. This collection of essays tackles Mexican culture and character. The chapters on the Mexican celebration of the Day of the Dead and the conquest are especially memorable. (Item no. MEX08)

Yucatan Before and After the Conquest

1978, PAPER, 162 PAGES, \$8.95

A 16th-century report by the first bishop of Yucatan, a dedicated ethnographer who has provided the most complete early European account of the Maya. With maps and handsome line drawings. (Item no. MYA15)

Tatiana Proskouriakoff

An Album of Maya Architecture

1989, PAPER, 142 PAGES, \$27.95

A classic work, first published in 1946. Scholar, artist, and architect Tatiana Proskouriakoff presents breathtaking artistic reconstructions of what the Maya sites may have looked like. (Item no. MYA06)

Michael Coe

Breaking the Maya Code

1999, PAPER, 304 PAGES, \$19.95

Mayan hieroglyphs were a linguistic puzzle until the 1952 breakthrough translation of a Mayan bark-paper text, as Coe explains in this history. The book also includes an extensive discussion of Maya studies and political activism in the wake of the linguistic discovery. (Item no. MYA30)

Simon Martin, Nikolai Grube

Chronicle of the Maya Kings and Queens, Deciphering the Dynasties of the Ancient Maya

2000, HARD COVER, 240 PAGES, \$34.95

The history of the Maya dynasties, encompassing biographies of 152 kings and queens, as gleaned from recently deciphered hieroglyphs. An unusual and rewarding book, illustrated in color and black-and-white. (Item no. MYA31)

John Lloyd Stephens, Karl Ackerman, Frederick Catherwood

Incidents of Travel in Yucatan

1996, PAPER, 286 PAGES, \$16.95

In this beloved classic, first published in 1843, Stephens chronicles his adventures and explorations in the Yucatan, including his rediscovery of important Maya sites, among them Chichen Itza, Uxmal, Kabah and Tulum. This traveler's edition features modern and archival photographs in addition to Frederick Catherwood's original lithographs. (Item no. MEX02)

Mary Ellen Miller

Maya Art and Architecture

1999, PAPER, 240 PAGES, \$14.95

An illustrated overview of the art and architecture of the Maya, making use of the latest discoveries at Tikal, Copan, and Palenque to demonstrate the range of Maya artistic influence. Highly recommended for travelers interested in a better understanding of Maya art. (Item no. MYA20)

Mark Van Stone, Michael Coe

Reading the Maya Glyphs

2005, PAPER, 160 PAGES, \$19.95

A compact, illustrated guide to commonly encountered Maya hieroglyphs with clear drawings and illuminating text; an excellent introduction to Maya writing for the traveler. (Item no. MYA26)

The Ancient Maya

A scholarly reference on everything Maya, including individual site descriptions, maps, and much else of interest to the serious student of Maya history and culture. (Item no. MYA07)

The Art of Mesoamerica, from Olmec to Aztec

2001, PAPER, 240 PAGES, \$16.95

An excellent survey of Mesoamerican art and architecture from 1500 BC to the Spanish conquest. Compact and profusely illustrated, it includes drawings, photographs and site plans. (Item no. MYA09)

The Cities of Ancient Mexico

1997, PAPER, 224 PAGES, \$16.95

A portrait of ancient civilizations in Mexico with chapters on the Oaxaca Valley, Teotihuacan and Palenque. Written by a renowned Mayanist, it also features insightful chapters on how archaeologists have reconstructed the past in Mexico. (Item no. MEX41)

Linda Schele, Peter Mathews

The Code of Kings, The Language of Seven Sacred Maya Temples and Tombs

1999, PAPER, 432 PAGES, \$20.00

A vivid guided tour of seven Maya sites, including Palenque, Tikal and Chichen Itza. This outstanding book features photos and line drawings throughout, and introductory chapters with a succinct introduction to Maya history and culture. (Item no. MYA13)

Reader's Companion to Mexico

1995, PAPER, 368 PAGES, \$17.00

This fine volume collects some of the best writing on Mexico, including excerpts by John Steinbeck, Langston Hughes, Graham Greene and many others. Each satisfyingly long excerpt is crisply introduced by Ryan with valuable historical and personal context. (Item no. MEX34)

Travelers' Tales Mexico

2001, PAPER, 404 PAGES, \$17.95

Outstanding stories and essays on the culture, politics and people of Mexico. A highly readable introduction to the country, organized by topic and featuring Carlos Fuentes, Octavio Paz and excerpts from dozens of travelogues. (Item no. MEX03)

Tropical Nature

1984, PAPER, 248 PAGES, \$14.00

A lively, lucid portrait of the rain forest as seen by two uncommonly observant and thoughtful field biologists. Its 17 marvelous essays introduce the habitats, ecology, plants and animals of the Central and South American rain forest. (Item no. GPS13)

Stephen Howell, Sophie Webb

A Guide to the Birds of Mexico and Northern Central America

1995, PAPER, 849 PAGES, \$39.95

Serious birders will want this definitive guide to the 1,070 bird species. It may be awkward to carry but it covers, in detail, all the birds you will see in the region. (Item no. FG15)

Animals and Plants of the Ancient Maya, A Guide

2002, PAPER, 400 PAGES, \$29.95

A comprehensive guide to the natural and cultural history of 100 plants and animals of the Maya world, primarily those from the lowland tropical forest of Central America but also including savanna, mangrove and coral reef habitats. (Item no. MYA29)
